1. Reports

# 1.1 Principal's report (KS)

There has been discussion in the community around equity of access to the school. This includes ramps for people with disabilities, older community members' ease of access and ramps for prams. The site is particularly difficult for access being sloping and with many stairs. The DoE assets team were at the school today and the easiest access route will be through Gruner Lane where there is one wide set of 6 steps where a ramp may be possible. Classrooms for 4A and 4N would still need to be accessed by stairs. The Asset Management Manager looked at access and will discuss with his department about how ramp access can be prioritised. However, due to funding and the priority for student access to site, it is unlikely that the ramp will be provided. While the situation is being reviewed, KS will open the Gurner Lane gates to the middle playground early in the morning for people to access the school. People with access issues can also call the school office to be advised of the best access for them.

There is a busy end of term coming up and communication will be important for everyone to stay in the loop about what is happening. Communication is a focus for term 4 with a new app coming which will make push notifications possible. The calendar is up to date and all key dates are down the side of the calendar online.

# **1.2** School budget update (KS)

There is a potential overspend of school budget which will be covered by the \$146k in community money. # 3.2 Reading groups and parent/carer involvement

Parents are very keen to get reading groups going again. The school is aiming for term 4 resumption of reading groups and other parent involvement.

# 3.3 Air-conditioning

Portable air conditioners are required due to heritage issues in some classrooms/buildings. There will be a trial of portable air-conditioning in K and Y1 classrooms in term 4 (5 portable air cons for 5 hottest classrooms). Permanent air conditioning will be installed for years 3 and 2 classrooms.

## Actions:

- AM and KS will get quote for 5 x portable air con and C block permanent air con (Ben Rafferty Air was recommended)
- KS will get an update on where we are in the cooler classrooms list

# 3.4 Extracurricular activities

Italian classes will be offered term 1 2023. CoAsIt has had difficultly getting teachers but expect to have more teachers in 2023. The school will advise which classrooms will be available on which days to offer to Italian classes.
