PDHPE

You Can Do It!

The students will be studying the You Can Do It! unit of Wellbeing. They will look at emotional buttons, calming your emotional brain, resilience and being grateful. The children will explore how to recognise emotions and develop strategies to self-regulate.

Got Game

In Physical Education student will participate in GOT GAME activities focussing on gymnastic skills.

Smiling Mind

Smiling Mind Mindfulness program will continue with a focus on strengths, gratitude, making decisions, setting goals and empathy.

Child Protection

Students will investigate whether the rights of others are being respected in given scenarios and use this information to identify behaviours that constitute various types of abuse. They will recognise that everyone has the right to be safe and that they can use their personal power and strengths to stand up for their own and others' rights in a safe and positive way.

History

In Term 3, students will continue the unit of work, "Community and Remembrance", also known as Then and Now. They will focus on the key inquiry questions:

Who lived here first and how do we know? How has our community changed? What features have been lost and what features have been retained? There will be a case study and walking excursion to Victoria Barracks.

Science

Students will be studying the unit, "Night and Day" from the Earth and Space strand of the Science Curriculum. Students explore the sizes, shapes, positions and movements of the Sun, Earth and Moon. They investigate how shadows change throughout the day and link these changes to the Sun's apparent movement across the sky. Students role-play the movements of the Earth in relation to the Sun and Moon. Through investigations, they explain night and day in terms of the Earth spinning on its axis.

Creative Arts

Visual Arts

In Visual Arts children will explore iconic Australian artworks such as 'On the Wallaby Tracks', 'Shearing the Rams' and 'The Ned Kelly Series'. Student will draw on these artist's style and subject matter to develop their own creations.

Drama

In Drama students will be developing dramatic skills and performance confidence, through scripted performances and reader's theatre. As an audience, students will watch and evaluate their peer's performances reflecting on the success criteria.

Music

Students will be engaging in music lessons with Ms Seymour this term.
