Science

The senior students will be continuing their work on Microbes for the first 4 weeks. They will then begin a mini unit studying "Light Shows" from the physical science strand of the Science Curriculum. In collaborative groups, students will be developing their scientific literacy to explore the properties of light and how they enable us to see. They will gather and compare data from various sources and present their observations in a variety of methods, including experimental recounts, graphs, models, tables and annotated diagrams.

History

The students will be continuing the unit 'Traditions and Heritage'. This unit will focus on the period of Australian history from 1800 to 1900 and provide opportunities for students to explore the contribution of different cultural groups in developing the Australian identity. The unit focuses on the development of the colony through investigating the diversity of Australian life, what has influenced it in the past, present day influences and the changing nature of these influences.

Creative Arts

In Visual Arts, students will explore how the colour gold has featured in art works through out history. Students will observe selected art works and create designs that are inspired by the works studied.

In Music, senior students will discuss features of music and their similarities and differences. They will notate, discuss and critique music of their own and play pieces of other students using Garage Band.

PDHPE

The senior students will be studying the 'You Can Do It' unit of 'Wellbeing, Happiness and Resilience.' They will learn to develop strategies about knowing how to remain calm and being able to stop themselves from getting extremely angry, down, or worried when something bad happens. They will also focus on strategies to control their behaviour when they are upset so that they can bounce back from difficulty and return to work or play.

In Child Protection, the students will study a unit called 'Power to Protect'. Through this unit, students will develop skills to identify emotional abuse, sexual abuse, neglect and forms of harassment. Students will also consider contextual factors that influence the safety of a situation and develop safety plans to lower their level of risk. Students will discuss and practise protective strategies that can be used to support and protect themselves and advocate for others.

The Smiling Mind Mindfulness program will focus on Strengths, Gratitude, Making Decisions, Setting Goals and Empathy.

In Physical Education student will participate in GOT GAME activities focussing on gymnastics.
