Stage 2 Term 1 Science

Students in Stage 2 will explore living things in the biology strand of the science curriculum. Students will look into life cycles, classification, make predictions and draw conclusions. Students will work scientifically to create scientific drawings, make predictions and draw conclusions.

Stage 2 Term 1 Geography

In Geography, the students will be studying the climates of the world and Australia. As part of the Australian Continent unit. Students will learn terms such as temperate, tropical and polar. They will learn about Australian biomes and their unique features. Skills such as map reading, positional language and atlas research will be consolidated throughout the unit.

Stage 2 Term 1 Creative Arts

In Visual Arts, the students will use a variety of techniques and media to create artworks depicting Australian themes.

Stage 2 Term 1 PDHPE

The students will be participating in the "You Can Do It" program with a focus on confidence, persistence, goal setting, time management and teamwork.

Students will participate in Smiling Minds on a weekly basis. They will follow a whole school programme which focuses on developing mindfulness practices.

All students will participate in Got Game where they are developing ball skills and a range of sports on Friday.
